# A FULLY ENGAGED FOUNDATION



As we write these lines, we are confined to our homes and the Coronavirus pandemic is in full swing. The entire Foundation team is in tele-commute mode and is working at finding solutions and implementing processes that will ensure its ongoing availability and support to the participants of the Let's Start Up program.

In these unstable and unprecedented times, women in vulnerable financial or social situations are especially affected. More than ever, they need support and guidance to reclaim their confidence and to pursue their commitment towards sustainable financial autonomy with pride and self-assurance. The Lise Watier Foundation is there for these women and the Let's Start Up program has never been more relevant than it is today.

Despite this crisis, which has transformed our daily lives since the month of March, the Foundation has had a successful year of development. We have guided more than 170 participants and have improved our services by hiring an expert entrepreneurship coach. We have opened a new center in the Laurentians and we have launched the Let's Start Up Facebook community, which is already enjoying great success. In addition, we

have pursued and developed new partnerships with the community and have reached record levels of fundraising through our annual benefit events.

We are proud of our accomplishments of these last months and, regardless of the storm we are currently weathering, we look to the future with resilience and optimism. We will draw upon our know-how to continue offering support to the women who need it.

### **OUR MISSION**

Active since 2009, the Lise Watier Foundation is driven by the desire to help women in vulnerable financial or social situations to reclaim confidence in their own abilities and to help them take control of their lives in order to build a future for themselves that is worthy of their abilities and aspirations.

By providing them the concrete means to develop their skills and self-confidence, we are availing women from here of the tools necessary to develop a life plan that will lead to their professional blossoming, and ultimately, to lasting financial independence.

By offering training, individual coaching and financial assistance, we can help these women to surpass themselves and ensure a better future for themselves and their children.

## 2019-2020 THE FOUNDATION IN ACTION MODE

The Foundation made strides on several fronts in 2019-2020, which has had a positive impact on the extent of our outreach as well as on the cause that drives us. The following is a brief overview of the principle achievements with which our team tasked itself over the course of the last 12 months.

#### A NEW CENTER IN THE LAURENTIANS

Since September 2019, the Foundation has been offering the program at La Porte de l'Emploi in the lower Laurentians region. Due to its strategic geographical location, this point of service has attracted a great number of participants from this booming area.

## A PRODUCTIVE MEETING FOR OUR ADVISORS

Once again, this year, a stimulating and enriching meeting was held for the advisors from the Let's Start Up program. In May, advisors from the four regions met in the inspiring setting of the Manoir Rouville-Campbell. Led by Jessica Grenier, entrepreneurial trainer, and Marielle Boyer,

our very own Program Director, they discussed current challenges in the field and shared their experiences. But most importantly, they refined their approaches to mentoring participants. Over the course of these two days, they were able to express their passion and commitment to what they do.

#### CLOSE AND LONG-TERM SUPPORT

With the aim of measuring the impact of the training and ensuring long-term support of our participants, we have introduced a new tool for collecting data. In addition, the team has grown in numbers and offers two new permanent resources that will allow more complete and longer-term counseling. From now on, an expert entrepreneurial coach will provide support to new entrepreneurs in implementing their business plans. A project manager will now ensure the monitoring of current and past participants' progress.







#### REMAINING CONNECTED DESPITE THE PANDEMIC

The crisis engendered by Covid-19, that we've been experiencing since the month of March, has forced us to find solutions to maintaining educational links with our participants and to continue coaching them. On very short notice, the members of the team put in place an online training platform to counter the suspension of in class training, as per the social distancing protocol required by the government.

In addition, in April, the Foundation launched the **Let's Start Up Facebook community**. This discussion and sharing venue allows participants of the program to interact with each other, as well as to watch webinars and access content pertinent to helping them fulfill their life plan. This user-friendly digital platform enables them to build relationships, to hone their skills, and ultimately, to improve upon the guidance process. It is also an excellent way to maintain contact with our





participants after they`ve completed their training. Over the period of just a few weeks, 125 women were active in the community...and that's only the beginning.

#### A MOVING GRADUATION CEREMONY

Last September, our first major graduation ceremony was held at one of Concordia University's prestigious ceremonial halls. At the ceremony, we acknowledged the hard work of the participants, who hail from the four regions of Quebec served by the Foundation, by conferring upon each of them a certificate from the Department of Continuing Education of Concordia. In their speeches, Lise Watier, Anne-Marie Croteau (Rector, John Molson School of Business), and Isabel Dunnigan (Associate Vice-President, Lifelong Learning) delivered inspiring words to the participants. It was a truly special and emotionally touching moment. In addition, our major donors had the chance to meet these admirable and resilient women who have made their dreams come true. An event marked by great pride and joy.

#### THE LET'S START UP PROGRAM STATISTICS

This year, we have supported more than 170 women towards financial independence.

- 97 new enrolments in four regions of Québec:
  - Among these, 86 chose the entrepreneurial path and are either starting or have completed the process of writing their business plan
  - 11 have taken steps to return to the job market
- 64 participants are being coached during the implementation of their business project
- 9 women, 8 of whom are single parents, have received financial aid for post-secondary studies

- 236 hours of training given
- 988 hours of individual coaching offered
- 16 businesses launched and a first microloan granted

This year, 9 women, eight of whom are single mothers, shared a bursary of \$93,000 to help facilitate their return to post-secondary education. These willful and determined future graduates were chosen by our board of directors who carefully studied all the applications received. Without a doubt, the financial support provided to these women will help them to complete their studies within a reasonable time frame and to stake their place on the job market.





## A FORMER PARTICIPANT OBTAINS A DOCTORAL BURSARY

Caroline Leblanc, one of the first young mothers to have received financial aid from the Lise Watier Foundation, was awarded a doctoral bursary by the Pierre Elliott Trudeau Foundation. A very prestigious bursary indeed! Today, Caroline works to defend the rights of the homeless and of those who are denied access to available resources. We are very proud of her exceptional career and life path.


